In 1944, 9-year-old Tomi Reichental was deported from his native Slovakia to the notorious Bergen-Belsen concentration camp. After the war, Tomi eventually settled in Ireland, where he married, had a family and never spoke of his ordeal. Since breaking his silence, Tomi has come close to evil in the form of one of his former SS guards and forged an unusual friendship with the granddaughter of a man who played a role in the murder of 35 members of his family.

Docents

A comprehensive training program prepares each docent to lead

tours for both school groups and general audiences. Throughout the year, tours are scheduled at various times during the week and on Sundays, providing a flexible schedule for volunteers.

Docents take groups through exhibits related to the Holocaust, Jewish History and Culture, and the temporary art exhibits.

Those interested will be given an information manual regarding the Holocaust and Jewish History and Culture, and will need to be available to shadow docents leading tours and to attend the art exhibit orientations and monthly meetings of the Committee of Docents.


Admissions Desk Volunteers
